My final mistake at St. Jude's was letting Allie write her thank you for the *Beacon* before I did. Now I am already teary as I begin writing and feel I need to live up to her example. So, I'll do what teachers always told me, start with the easy stuff. Thank You for the wonderful celebration – thank you to the vestry for planning my farewell, to all those who helped set-up and clean-up, to so many of you for your kind notes, and even to those who made me cry during communion with your messages. Thank you to the choir for their final blessing, to those who spoke, most especially Les and Sue who joined us after leading worship in other communities. And maybe most important of all, thank you to all of you for forgiving me my mistakes of the past and making it such a wonderful celebration with your good wishes, your applause, the entire mood of the day, and your tears.

"Nine years is enough time to fall in love with you (the Hoover family)," Dave James wrote in his beautiful poem. And it was. We, Allie and I, the kids, all of us fell in love with all of you in our time here. But here is the thing about falling in love; it feels wonderful, but it can be blinding. The rest of the world can fade away as you focus only on that one relationship. And you can become too comfortable when you trust people and know people so well; too comfortable to push when pushing is needed, too aware of the pains and needs of others to ask for help.

In the past year or so, I came to a place where I worried that my job had gotten too easy, where the church's love for me was so great that you weren't asking me to stretch and grow. And I was so in love with you that I no longer was pushing for this church to strive to be more. In fact, I think I was becoming more a member of St. Jude's than the leader that you both need and deserve.

I don't know if my family and I will ever have the kind of loving relationship with another congregation that we had at St. Jude's. But I believe that it is time for me to leave my comfort zone, leave a place that was home in so many different ways, in order to make a difference in another place. It is time to do my best to serve God and the church by offering my gifts to others even if it may mean the loss of an amazingly loving and supportive community.

Please know that all of the things that you expressed, your love and sorrow, your thanks for the things I've done while here, that all of them were fully reciprocated. We were so well cared for in so many different ways that I can't begin to thank everyone enough. Please continue to offer your love and trust to those who come after me, give them your support and minister to them even as you ministered to me. St. Jude's can continue to be an amazing worshiping community, but only if you continue to love each other and the strangers, both clergy and lay, who come in your doors.

Thank you for blessing us, thank you for being partners in ministry, examples of faith, and most of all, for being our friends. Our love will not leave with us; you will have it always, and we know we go forth into a new adventure well equipped because of all the good things you have done for us.
