Holy Week and Easter Services March 29 - April 5, 2015

Palm Sunday - March 29, 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.

The most emotional day of the year goes from the triumphant entry into Jerusalem to Jesus' horrible trial and crucifixion. The 10:30 service will begin outside on the corner of Elizabeth and Leroy Streets.

Holy Monday and Tuesday - March 30 and 31, 7:00 p.m.

Short, quiet services with time to meditate on Jesus' final days.

Holy Wednesday Tenebrae - April 1, 7:00 p.m.

A traditional combination of Morning and Evening Prayer especially created for Holy Week, we slowly darken the church as we accompany Jesus to the cross.

Maundy Thursday - April 2, 6:00 - 8:00 p.m.

Experience with the disciples the washing of the feet, the Agape meal, and the institution of Holy Communion, followed by the arrest of Jesus. There will be a stripping of the altar. After the service, take time for quiet prayer during our overnight vigil at the Altar of Repose.

Good Friday - April 3

12:00 p.m. - Community service at Fenton United Methodist Church.

3:00 p.m. - Stations of the Cross (child friendly). This participatory service has proven to be meaningful to people of all ages. Walk with Jesus to his crucifixion and join in activities that help remind us of how his sacrifice is still relevant today.

7:00 p.m. - Traditional Episcopal Good Friday Service. Favorite hymns and the moving devotions at the cross.

Easter Sunday - April 4

Easter Vigil - 7:00 a.m.

Gather with the disciples to read scripture and sing songs in remembrance of how God has worked in the world. Then move into the church for the joyous Easter Acclamation and festive Eucharistic celebration of the resurrection. This is THE Easter moment, as we literally watch darkness turn to light. This service is followed by a breakfast – all are welcome to attend.

Festival Eucharist - 10:30 a.m.

Our Easter celebration is full of joy, promise, and Alleluias. Join us for the highest of holy days.

Lenten Study/Soup Supper Wednesdays in Lent 5:30-7:30 p.m. Mar. 4 - St. Jude's Mar. 11 - First Presbyterian Mar. 18 - St. Jude's Mar. 25 - First Presbyterian

Our Lenten Study will follow the book *The Last Week* by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan. While the book is excellent and full of great information, reading it for the session is not required. Each night we will have a meal, fellowship, and learning. This program is a joint venture with St. Jude's and First Presbyterian Church. Childcare will be provided. Thursday Bible Study

Two Thursdays a month (usually 2nd and 4th) 12:00 noon

We are walking through the Pentateuch (the first 5 books of the Bible). We are currently finishing up Numbers. It's a chance to get a detailed look at the Hebrew Scripture and ask Heather any questions that you might have about scripture, the Bible, religion in general. By moving a bit more slowly through the books, we are able to find things that we never even knew were in the Bible! You are welcome to join when you are able and do not have to worry about coming "in the middle" of any particular theme. You can bring a personal Bible or use one of those located at church.

OUTREACH UPDATES

There has been lots of outreach activity this month. Thanks to the generosity of St. Jude's, we have many neighbors with more food on their tables, socks on their feet and diapers on their bums. In January, we had our most successful Truckload Food Giveaway ever. In cooperation with Play Like Jackson and the Fenton Fire Fighters we passed out thirteen tons of food in less than three hours!!

In February, members of St. Jude's purchased over 900 pairs of men's socks for guests at Carriage Town Ministries and 9,000 diapers for the children at Carriage Town's shelter for women and children. You have also been hearing about the opportunities we have to support Family Promise. Our first support week is coming up beginning March 8 and we still have some open spots for volunteers.

On the heels of Family Promise is our School Lunch Food Program.* It will take place on Saturday, April 4, from 9 a.m.- 3 p.m. at St. Jude's. Once again this year we will be including Easter Baskets for the kids. Many thanks to our friends at Fenton United Methodist and those who contribute goodies on behalf of the Easter Bunny (a collection bin will be available). We continue to do our best to fulfill St. Jude's mission of Seeking and Worshipping God, Reaching out to others. Thanks to everyone who contributes in so many ways.

*The Cereal Challenge

The Outreach Committee is challenging every member of St. Jude's to donate 1-2 boxes of cereal in the month of March to help build our pantry for the Spring School Lunch program. That means every member of each family, as we need to collect 250 boxes of cereal. This is the 9th year we have provided food for children in the Fenton area during spring break, when they do not have free or reduced price lunches at school. The committee purchases most of the food using a grant received from the local CROP Walk, but we could use some assistance. Please drop off your cereal in the front right corner of the church near the baptismal font. We are going to build of tower of cereal that reaches toward the banner of The Holy Spirit, to remind us of the good work we can do with God's help.

Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday will look a little different this year. We'll start with the foot washing, share an Agape meal, and then move to the church to strip the altar.

Agape is love in Greek. An agape meal is a time to be together as a community and share a simple meal together. You are invited to bring some food to contribute or just come along to enjoy. A sign up sheet will have some ideas (most with a Mediterranean theme), but you are welcome to bring anything that you might like to share with others.

Baptism

"Baptism is the initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body the Church. The bond which God establishes in Baptism is indissoluble" (BCP, 298)

At our baptism, it is the moment when we become one of God's family; God adopts us in as his children. The parents, sponsors, and gathered assembly all pledge support to a person being baptized.

If you or someone you know is not yet baptized and would like to be, talk to Heather. The church has some "regular" days for baptism that include Easter (hopefully the Vigil) - April 5, Pentecost - May 24, All Saints' Day or the Sunday after All Saints' Day - Nov. 1, and the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (not until 2016). However, baptism is welcome at almost any Sunday principal service (Lent is a restricted time).

I look forward to working with you and your family to participate in this rite and have the community express welcome and love to you. We can work out dates and prepare all of the people involved.

Confirmation, Reception, Reaffirmation

Saturday, May 2nd at 3 p.m.

Trinity Episcopal Church, Bay City

Confirmation - for a person who is already baptized and would like to make a public statement of faith.

Reception - for a person who was confirmed in another denomination and would like to be received into the Episcopal Church.

Reaffirmation - for a person who has been baptized and confirmed and would like to make a public statement reaffirming one's faith.

There will be a diocesan liturgy on May 2 at Trinity Episcopal Church in Bay City. Bishop Todd Ousley will confirm, receive, and reaffirm those who are prepared and present themselves to him. If you are interested in participating in one of these rites, please let Heather know soon so that the preparation can begin. (There is a time of learning together for those who are to be confirmed and received.)
