When I took the ALS challenge at the end of the summer (you can find the video on both my and the church's Facebook page), I challenged the members of St. Jude's to not only give to ALS, but to other groups and institutions that you believe are doing the work of God in the world. Specifically, I challenged everyone to give 10% of their pledge to other organizations. To use the good things that God has given you to make a difference in the world and do your part to make this world more like the kingdom of heaven.

The thing is, I strongly suspect that most of you are already doing this. I have seen your generosity when we ask for help for the CROP Walk, socks for the homeless, the Read and Feed Program, or places where our church needs extra help. I suspect that church is neither the only place that you give to nor the only place you give through. And I think we all need to be reminded of that from time to time. While our Outreach committee does excellent work giving us opportunities to support great programs with our money and volunteer time, it is not, by far, the only outlet.

And that is what we hope to do this year as part of our Stewardship Campaign. We hope to celebrate not only the generosity of our members when it comes to supporting the church, but also how our members are giving to the greater community and the world. When you receive your pledge card this year, it will include an opportunity to let us know where else your money is going this year – an opportunity to list all of those places you are sharing your treasure in order to be a good steward of your blessings. After the campaign, we will be making a list of all those different organizations, movements, and programs that are being supported by our church; a list of all the ways we are blessing the world.

So why 10%? Well, the standard the church uses for giving is the tithe, which is equal to 10% of our income. Our family pledges 10% of my pay back to the church, and money from Allie's salary goes to other causes. If the church asks you to give 10%, then it seems reasonable to me that the church should also ask that you give 10% of that for other things that are doing God's work in the world.

It has been said that to know what a person really cares about, you only need to look inside of their checkbook, though in this day and age their credit card bill would be a more likely place. This is a chance to share, anonymously, what you care about. I am excited to see the results, and learn about all the great things being supported by members of our St. Jude's family. I am excited to see how you are being faithful stewards of the good things God has blessed you with.

Maybe you are moved by the work of Heifer to bring sustainability to poor farmers, or by the work of the Red Cross to respond to disasters with immediate relief. Maybe you have a loved one who died or has been diagnosed with a specific disease, or maybe you have a passion for education and literacy. Whatever your reason, whatever the cause, God has made you excited, or even driven, to make creation a better place. And that is not only your gift to the world, but the knowledge that you have done this is God's gift to you.
