## A Service of Remembrance for Children Who Have Died

St. Jude's Episcopal Church, Fenton Monday, December 29, 7:00 p.m.

Three days after Christmas Day, in the Church's calendar, comes the *Feast of the Holy Innocents*. It is one of the dark mysteries of our faith that the birth of the Savior was also the cause for the slaughter of children - when King Herod had put to the sword all children under the age of two in the town and surrounding areas of Bethlehem.

We invite especially all those who have lost children of their own. This can include loss by miscarriage, abortion, violence, stillbirth, or any other circumstances. No one will be asked to share their specific loss, or story. That will remain between each worshiper and God. At the Offertory, names of children will be gathered, with a choice whether or not you wish each name read aloud. We will also read the names of children buried from this Church (and other Churches if they wish).

The service itself will be the Holy Eucharist. The beauty of this service will be a fitting memorial to that experience of grief which never leaves the heart of each who have lost children. As is our tradition, this service and the Holy Communion is open to people of any religious persuasion, as well as those who have no spiritual home.

Thanks to the Diocese of Eastern Michigan, Family Promise of Genesee County, the same group that we support four times a year, has received a \$10,000 grant for next year. We are thankful for their support of this incredible ministry.

#### Buy SCRIP – Help Our Church – No Cost to You

As you think about your Christmas shopping, please consider buying SCRIP cards this month. SCRIP are gift cards to all kinds of stores, and you will receive, dollar for dollar, exactly what you pay in gift cards to iTunes, VG's, gas stations, clothing stores, restaurants, and all kinds of different places. You can use the cards to purchase gifts, or give the cards themselves. And the church receives a percentage of every card purchased, sometimes as much as 18%. Normally you can order SCRIP cards the first and third Sundays of the month and pick them up the following week, but in December they can be ordered on the first and second Sundays so they will all be available before Christmas. Last year we made over \$2000 in SCRIP money. Please help us better that number this year.

Upon hearing the news of Josh, Allie and the Hoover children leaving St. Jude's as Josh moves to a new position at St. James, Birmingham, many have expressed the difficulty they are having in telling Josh, and Allie what their tenure here at St. Jude's has meant to them, how they have touched our lives.

Please take a moment to write down a memory for them. There will be a jar to collect them in to send along with the Hoover's as they make their way to new beginnings. Below is the letter from Josh to the congregation that was sent out the third week of November.

#### Dear Friends,

I write to you today to announce that I have accepted the position of Priest in Charge at St. James in Birmingham, MI. My time with them will begin on January 1<sup>st</sup> of 2015 and my last service at St. Jude's will be on Sunday, Dec. 28<sup>th</sup>.

The last nine years have been amazing for me and my family. People thought we were crazy when we told them we were moving to Fenton, MI (most had to find it on a map). But there is no doubt in my mind that the work the search committee and I did back then was filled with the Holy Spirit. There could not have been a more welcoming place, a more forgiving space for me to make my mistakes in, or a more comfortable fit. And look at the good work we have done together. We started and grew the Spring Break Feeding Program together, we tried different kinds of worship both old and new, we greatly deepened our relationship with First Presbyterian Church, and learned and grew and have had an awful lot of fun together.

Going to St. James was not an easy decision for me to make. There are many wonderful things about them, and there will be many new professional challenges for me. All of this is to be expected with a change. What made this difficult was knowing we would have to say goodbye. I can't begin to tell you the love that I have, that my whole family has, for this congregation. Nor can I begin to tell you how much your love for us has meant. I have been so well supported here that at times I have had to be careful when talking to colleagues so as not to make them too jealous. For all three of my children, St. Jude's is their only church. When we were trying to figure out dates, Julia begged for us to have one more Christmas here in our church. And don't forget that you, all of you, are still godparents to Timothy.

We will have some opportunities to say goodbye over the next month and a half, and I will do my best to make space for any who want to meet with me in private. But there are a few things I want you to hear now. The first is that I have been in conversation with both Bishop Ousley and Michael Spencer, our Canon to the Ordinary. They are already thinking about next steps for St. Jude's and will be there with their support every step of the way. Enclosed in this mailing is a letter from Josephine Feijoo, our Senior Warden, and Bill Anderson, our Junior Warden. They have already invited Michael to come meet with the vestry in December so more plans can be made. I have complete confidence that you are in good hands with our wardens, our vestry, and the diocesan staff.

The second thing you should hear is a little harder for me to say. Leaving really does mean leaving. As of the end of year I will be unavailable as a priest or pastor. I will not be able to return to St. Jude's or take part in weddings or funerals. This may seem harsh, but long history in many churches has shown that it is best for all of us and allows us to better create new, healthy relationships. Friendships, outside of church, can and I hope will, still continue, but the pastoral relationship will need to end. Finally, please know that I believe in a great future for St. Jude's. This is an amazing congregation and I have no doubt that, when the time comes, you will have excellent people to choose from as your next priest. God is doing some great things through the people of this congregation, and that will continue regardless of my presence. You will remain in my prayers and I have no doubt that God's blessings will be with you and the work you do.

We are leaving this church, but our love remains. St. Jude's will always be held close in our hearts.

There are two convenient December Sunday <u>Scrip order</u> dates: December 7 and 14 -- with SCRIP pick-up dates the following Sundays on December 14 and 21.

As an alternative to purchasing a gift or SCRIP, you can also **donate money**. If you prefer to donate money for a gift or SCRIP, please write a check to St. Jude's, and note on the check it is for "Christmas Families." This can be placed in an offering plate, placed in the church office, or handed to Carol or John Pettipher or any other Outreach Committee member.

**Volunteers** are also importantly needed to contact a family and mutually schedule a date and time to deliver the gifts to the Christmas Family (e.g., parent(s)) between Sunday, December 21 and Wednesday, December 24). There will be a space for you to sign up for this on the Christmas Families Lists in VandenBergh Hall.

Thank you for your generosity in this always-present need to help others in our community!
