Holy Week and Easter Services March 20-27, 2016

Palm Sunday / Passion Sunday - 8:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 5 p.m.

The most emotional day of the year goes from the triumphant entry into Jerusalem to Jesus' horrible trial and crucifixion. The 10:30 service will begin outside, on the corner of Elizabeth and Leroy Streets.

Holy Monday – Holy Eucharist – 7:00 p.m.: A quiet service with time to meditate on Jesus' final days.

Holy Tuesday – Seder – 6:00 p.m.: We will celebrate a traditional Jewish Seder.

Holy Wednesday - Tenebrae - 7:00 p.m.: A traditional combination of Morning and Evening Prayer especially created for Holy Week, we slowly darken the church as we accompany Jesus to the cross.

Maundy Thursday – 7:00 p.m.: Experience with the disciples the washing of the feet and the institution of Holy Communion, followed by the arrest of Jesus. After the service, take time for quiet prayer during our overnight vigil; you can sign up for a time on the board in VandenBergh Hall.

Good Friday

12:00 p.m.: Ecumenical service at Fenton United Methodist Church.

3:00 p.m.: Children's Good Friday service at St. Jude's.

7:00 p.m.: Traditional Episcopal Good Friday service at St. Jude's. Favorite hymns and the moving devotions at the cross join a Good Friday sermon.

Easter Sunday (Choir sings at both services)

Easter Vigil – 7:00 a.m.: Gather with the disciples to read scripture and sing songs in remembrance of how God has worked in the world. Then move into the church for the joyous Easter Acclamation and festive Eucharistic celebration of the resurrection. This is THE Easter moment, as we literally watch darkness turn to light.

Breakfast – 9 a.m.: Come for breakfast between the services. Sign up for food if you are able. (A great way to thank the choir for singing at both services that day!)

Festival Eucharist – 10:30 a.m.: Our Easter celebration is full of joy, promise, and Alleluias. Join us for the highest of holy days.

Messy Church – 5 p.m. Come celebrate and participate in Easter activities!

SUPPORTING OUR NEIGHBORS

I have been attending a series of classes/forums on the FLINT WATER CRISIS by U of M-all campuses. The University is committed to disseminating correct information for the community along with expert information on municipal water systems, infra-structure, health effects, and vehicles for lead, copper, toxicity in water and solutions for the water contamination. The Officer of Public Health-Genesee spoke at a recent class and informed us that Flint restaurants are going out of business due to people being afraid to drink Flint water. He clarified that there is a program in place and monitored by them to assure the safety of the water used in cooking and serving. He encouraged us to go out to dinner in Flint as business people had taken measures to ensure their water is safe. This is being monitored and ensured by the Health Department. Going out to dinner in Flint is a simple thing we can do to support our neighbor's in their time of trouble. I have discussed with Dave Rayner possible additional actions St. Jude's can do to help with the crisis.

Some restaurants in Flint are 501 Grille, Flint Crepe Co., Halo Burger, Good Bean's, Churchill's, The Torch, El Posteros. The Flint Farmer's Market is open Tues., Thurs., Sat., 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and they feature a number of eateries. Enjoy.
