On one of our recent road trips, Dave and I were driving along 131 and all of a sudden near Kalkaska a tree emerged at the side of the road. A very tall tree. A very different tree. A tree decorated with hundreds of shoes. Shoes hanging off every branch I could see. A tree dripping with shoes.

So, what does one do when one confronts something so incredibly odd? I pulled out my phone and googled "shoe tree." And we read all the stories we could find as we drove along. You can even find maps locating shoe trees across the country! Who knew?

I found myself asking, why would people throw a perfectly fine pair of shoes up into the branches of a tree? Well, for many it seems that this is a way to mark life changes. Grow out of a pair of shoes.....visit the tree, tie the laces of each shoe together, and throw the pair way up into the branches. Graduate high school.....visit the tree and toss your shoes up. Major life events marked by decorating a tree with something tangible. Leave behind a pair of shoes and as you leave the tree you walk into a new way of being.

That tree got me to thinking. We mark major events in the church as well. As I read the stories of the shoe trees, it became very clear that adding your shoes to a particular tree is really a liturgical action. And it seems to be very meaningful for a lot of people.

As Advent winds its way to Christmas, our theme turns once again to newness. The reality of Emmanuel, "God with us." We mark this event liturgically in a lot of ways. But I wonder, how might we deepen our experience of Advent and Christmas?

I'd like to offer some questions for reflection as you move forward into this newness. What is the growing edge in your life within the church and in your relationship with God? What is the newness that God is calling you to? What might be getting in the way of truly embracing that newness? What do you need to leave behind in order to move into a new way of being? What might be a good representation – a symbol of that which needs to be left behind? How might you tangibly leave that symbol behind so you are better able to walk into and through your growing edge? How will you recognize when you have embraced that newness faithfully? How might you honor that newness?

May you recognize and embrace newness in your life. May you walk confidently with God into new ways of being that honor that newness.

ST. JUDE'S ENDOWMENT NEWS

Since January of 1987, St. Jude's church has supported outreach based endowment activity through the Heritage Fund. As we approach thirty years of continuous endowment based activity, the options for providing long-term future support of ministry activities at St. Jude's have been enhanced and improved.

We now have a more complete and expanded offering of choices that includes

- Heritage Fund To meet the unmet material and spiritual needs of the parish, community and church universal.
- Capital Fund For the maintenance and preservation of our historic buildings and grounds.
- Eternal Pledge Fund To support the annual operation of the church and provide long-term support for the daily church operations.

Endowment News, continued

The types of planned giving options have also been expanded from the traditional Bequest in a Will. Gifts of cash, securities, real estate, life insurance, and personal property are now included. Deferred gifts and other tax advantage based methods of giving are now possible ways to help fund endowments.

Starting on December 4th we will be providing additional information regarding the new and enhanced endowment offerings that are now available. We look forward to providing opportunities for all to help fund St. Jude's future.

THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU!!!!

Thank you to all who attended and participated in our focus group as we reflected on Children and Youth Ministry at St. Jude's! We learned, as we felt going into this gathering, that Messy Church has been a wonderful success full of learnings and celebrations. That being said, there have also been challenges. The intent of this focus group was to take all of things we want to celebrate and keep while also addressing the challenges. We wanted to tease out what it is the family of St. Jude's is looking for in a formation program for children and youth and incorporate those values.

A wonderful group of 26 people stayed after church, told stories, drew out values, and dreamed of a new way forward. All of the information that we shared is posted on the sanctuary wall. If you weren't there, take a look. See the stories we shared that were high points of involvement and powerful moments of transformation in Children and Youth Ministry.

Positives we want to carry with us:

- The story-telling in worship asked wondering questions that evoked a wonderful and layered depth of responses linking scripture with our own life experiences.
- Worship was easy to access for all ages and encouraged participation, especially as everyone gathered around the Altar to celebrate Eucharist.
- This experience invited creativity across all generations that linked to the message of the day in a powerful way.
- There was participation from those who are not currently a part of the St. Jude's community and as those families got more involved with Messy Church, there was some participation in other St. Jude's activities.
- The pattern of the Biblical stories that were unpacked highlights the thread that links Old and New Testaments helping us better hear the work of how God's people are connected through time.
- The intergenerational experience helped us all to better honor and see the wisdom and gifts across generations.

Challenges we want to address:

- There is a perception, particularly in the 10:30 a.m. service, that children and youth have not been present in worship since Messy Church began. The reality is that almost every single week there are children and youth present.
- When the formation program for children and youth is in the evening, it makes it challenging for families to be present twice once in the morning for adult formation and worship and then again in the evening for Messy Church. Many families have felt they had to choose between one or the other.
- Keeping children and youth together for Messy Church in a one-room-school-house kind of model made it a challenge to address the unique needs of each.

The plan moving forward:

- The children will gather during the 10:30 a.m. service. They will begin their time together at 10:15 a.m. and will join the worshipping community at The Peace so they are present for the entire Eucharistic action.
 - This will mean that we need to have volunteers to work with the children on a rotating basis.
 Our commitment will be to work with the volunteers and to provide helpful curriculum so they feel comfortable taking on this responsibility.
- The youth group will gather following the 10:30 a.m. service and will be present for the entirety of our worship service.
 - This will be an opportunity for us to be more creative with worship to help to engage all generations in a meaningful way as we continue to respect the voices of our young people actively engaging them and learning from them.

We are very excited about these changes that emerged in our focus group! They will allow us to continue to bring the best that we have learned and grown into with our Messy Church experience into a new patter of worship and formation. Separating the youth from the children for formation will allow us to creatively focus on each group's unique needs. It is our hope that our program will continue to expand and touch the lives of even more children and young people. It is also our hope to offer intergenerational activities at various times throughout the church year.

Thank you, St. Jude's, for valuing all ages and stages of life in our family. You have heard it said that it takes a village to raise a child. In much the same way there is much wisdom and value of all of us walking together, learning together, sharing faith together, growing together as we all grow closer to one another and to God. Thank you for being a valuable part of that journey!

Some parents hope for gas and/or store gift cards, and several of you have provided families with these in prior years. Please provide all purchased Scrip cards to the church office (or lock box outside the office) in a sealed envelope showing the Family Number (#), Scrip cash value, and your name. There are two convenient December Sunday Scrip order dates: December 4 and 11 -- with Scrip Pickup dates the following Sundays on December 11 and 18.

As an alternative to purchasing a gift or Scrip, you can also **donate money**. If you prefer to donate money for a gift or Scrip, please write a check to St. Jude's, and note on the check it is for "Christmas Families." This can be placed in an offering plate, placed in the church office (or lock box), or handed to Carol or John Pettipher or any other Outreach Committee member.


