## Holy Week at St. Jude's

Our Holy Week begins with our Palm Sunday, April 9th service. At our 8:00 a.m. and  ${\cal P}_{\cal I}$ 10:30 a.m. services we will join with Jesus and



the disciples as they triumphantly entered Jerusalem.



Monday, April 10th, at 7:00 p.m. we will continue our journey as we gather to share in a Taize service.

On Tuesday, April 11th at 7:00 p.m. we will encounter all of the symbols of Easter through a series of reflections. This will be an opportunity to see the symbols that we are familiar with in a new way. Having traversed this journey of



encounter, when the symbols appear during the Paschal Triduum (The Great Three Days of Easter), they will come alive in a new way.



Wednesday, April 12th at 7:00 p.m. we will gather for our Tenebrae service. Tenebrae is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness". During the service candles are gradually extinguished while a series of readings and psalms are read.

#### Great Vigil of Easter, Sunday, April 16th –

This is our "Night of nights" when we will gather at 7:00 am to kindle the Easter fire, light the Paschal torch, proclaim the great stories of salvation, renew our baptismal promises, and celebrate the



first Eucharist of Easter. Following the Liturgy we will share in our annual Easter reception. A pot-luck breakfast will be served between the Vigil and the 10:30am service.

#### Easter Morning, April 16th -

The First Sunday of Easter brings the Paschal Tridu-

um to a close and launches us upon the great fifty-day season of Easter. Come to Eucharist at 10:30 am.

# Music Notes

This April is a liturgically rich month of contrasts. The readings for April 2, the fifth Sunday of Lent, include the story of God bringing the valley of dry bones back to life from Ezekiel and the raising of Lazarus by

Jesus. The glory of these forty days and Hail, thou once despised Jesus! close these Sundays of Lent.

April 9, Palm Sunday, is a joyous celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. The mood changes dramatically as our services for Holy Week begin on Monday. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services offer further opportunities for musical expression.

Easter, April 16, begins with Easter Vigil. The readings review the path of salvation through the scriptures that reaches finality with the resurrection of our Lord. The musical selections further illustrate these themes. Easter joys continue with Jesus Christ is risen today, and Hail thee, festival day!

April 23 is known as Thomas Sunday because we review the story of him seeing and believing in the resurrected Lord. We walk by faith, and not by sight illustrates this truth.


# The St. Jude's Endowment Funds – "Pay It Forward"

Some year's finances have been a challenge and recently we have had to dip into our savings to make ends meet, but we have never wavered in our commitment to one another or to St. Judes. The Eternal Pledge Fund is a new way of donating gifts and/or bequests that will help St. Jude's meet the needs of the future.
