Last week we celebrated the Paschal Triduum – the most holy week of the Christian year. It was a busy week in the life of the church with services every weeknight as we journeyed to Jerusalem, the cross and then celebrated the chaos and eventual joy of the empty tomb. So much work goes into this particular week! Bulletins for all of the services. Lots of musical preparation. Altar color changes along with a variety of work to set up and clean up each service. More services means more liturgical support folks serving.

Thank you to so many who took on a lot of extra duties to help us all to celebrate well. Liz, for all of your support work in preparing bulletins. All the volunteers who came and folded extra bulletins. Readers, Eucharistic Ministers and Intercessors for taking on extra responsibilities. Marlene and the choir for a lot of extra preparation. Kris for all that you did to help our Holy Week at home be such a success as we folded crosses, colored Lenten posters and made Holy Week in a box. Kris's work didn't end there either. She helped us to find the Alleluia's and then laminated them hanging them on one of our Lenten Narnia trees. Those who took on cleaning and tidying up responsibilities. And every one who gathered to worship at all or some of the Holy Week and Paschal Triduum (The Great Three Days of Easter) celebrations.

What a joy to spend this first Holy Week with all of you! What a holy experience it was for me. Every year I take away snapshots of various liturgies that strike me in a particularly powerful way.

Monday's Taize service provided a quiet moment to reflect on the power of all that happened as Jesus turned his face to Jerusalem. Tuesday, as we reflected on all of the symbols of Easter, I will forever remember a video in my mind of one worship attender picking up the large Good Friday cross and processing it into Vandenburgh Hall and then returning it to its stand. The "gong" that accompanied the darkness of the Tenebrae service will echo in my head for some time I think. On Maundy Thursday two folks who washed one another's feet lightly touched the other's head in a wonderful, personally powerful moment. On Good Friday one young parishioner knelt at the foot of the cross for a time of personal prayer and after leaving that sacred spot returned to hug the cross. Sunday's vigil was amazing as the fire leapt to light and as Bill McDonald canted the Exultet. Magic happened when the Hall was somehow transformed to a dining room as a most excellent brunch was laid out for all. Sunday's service was gloriously uplifting as we celebrated the chaos and confusion of the empty tomb.

These, and so many more moments, stand out for me as particularly holy moments. Moments that provide a glimpse into the very real presence of God and how each of us responds differently. Moments that help me to see the face of God in a new way.

My Camp Chickagami experiences as a camper, then a counselor and staff person, over a 5-year period were some of the most important - and fun — things I ever did in my entire life. I learned tremendous things about my fellow peer campers and counselors — and myself — that provided me lifelong values and skills. I still remember fantastic, great things we did as campers and counselors that make Camp Chickagami one of the happiest, greatest periods of my life. Some of the fun things today include: swimming, boating, canoe trips, hiking, fishing, exploring nature, crafts, archery, sports, and all-camp evening activities. The outdoor campfires and St. Andrews Chapel services are also very special.

There are six (6) **Youth Camp programs** during our 2017 summer:

•	Trip Camp	July 9 – 15	Grades 8 – 11
•	Bell Bay Camp	July 16 – 22	Grades $3-5$
•	Counselor-in-Training (CIT)	July 16 – 22	Grades 10 – 11
•	Huron Camp	July 23 – 29	Grades $8 - 11$

Camp tuition is \$340 -- and scholarship assistance is available to any camper wishing to attend camp, but needing financial assistance. Scholarship assistance is available from both St. Jude's and our Diocese. It has been the tradition of St. Jude's to hold an auction, semi-annually, to raise money for the general operating fund to off-set our deficit budget. It is also important to note that 10% of the proceeds go to our Outreach program. This year the auction will take on a new look, reducing overhead costs, eliminating ticket prices, cutting the work load for volunteers, extending the days of bidding, and simplifying the general process. We hope that you will be open and supportive of this style of auction, and willing to evaluate its success for future planning.

Here's how the event will work: the silent auction portion will take place three consecutive Sundays in a row. Bidding time will take place after the 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. services each week, with final bids ending around 12:15 p.m. on the 3rd Sunday. (Bids will carry through from week to week.) All the silent auction items will be gift baskets donated by the good people of St. Judes. We hope to have 25 baskets of varying theme and value. (\$30-\$125) There will be a list of theme ideas on the bulletin board to get your creative juices flowing if you need help, or come up with one of your own. Choosing and signing up for a theme early will give you plenty of time to look for items during the summer and early fall. If you need assistance arranging and wrapping your basket, the committee will be happy to help.

After the final bids are ended for the silent auction on the 3rd Sunday (November 19th), a live auction presenting works of art created by our parishioners, as well as culinary offerings, wine tastings or boat trips, will take place. You will be able to view the live auction items each week in advance. A special coffee hour will add to your enjoyment. We invite our 8:00 a.m. members to return to church by noon for all the festivities. Also, encourage friends and relatives to join you for worship and fellowship on auction Sundays.

Watch for more information and reminders about the Blessings in a Basket Auction as the time grows near, keeping in mind how blessed we are to be part of the St. Jude's family.
