Finally, he would be able to see something other than the same old books he's been seeing for two years! And I knew if my Flat Jesus was excited, I could only imagine how excited each Flat Jesus that a St. Jude's parishioner took out into the world would be. He might be wondering what he was going to see. Would he be taken along for grand adventures? Would he join in everyday activities? Who would he meet? Family? Friends? Strangers?

What I discovered on carrying my Flat Jesus with me through my daily activities at General Convention was that I was much more conscious of the presence of Jesus all of the time. I found this interesting as I'm a person who is almost always conscious of the presence of Jesus.

Do you have a desire to preach?

We invite you to consider joining the licensed lay preacher training program.

Training to become a licensed preacher in the Diocese of Eastern Michigan consists of two components that can be taken concurrently or in order:

- 1. Course in Holy Scripture through the Academy for Vocational Leadership or a comparable program
- 2. Preaching Practicum

Participants begin their preparation with the course in Holy Scripture offered at the Academy for Vocational Leadership. The course meets monthly over ten Saturdays, September through June at the Colombiere Retreat Center in Clarkston. The cost is \$500, which includes lunch and materials. There will be an additional cost for textbooks.

The Preaching Practicum meets over twelve sessions, with site and class schedule to be determined by the students and instructor. Participants will learn about, discuss, and practice preaching both in their classes and in their home congregations. The cost for this section is \$400, plus textbooks.

What Is the Bible?: How an Ancient Library of Poems, Letters, and Stories Can Transform the Way You Think and Feel About Everything – By Rob Bell

Below is a summary from Amazon:

Rob takes us deep into actual passages to reveal the humanity behind the Scriptures. You cannot get to the holy without going through the human, Rob tells us. When considering a passage, we shouldn't ask "Why did God say . . .?" To get to the heart of the Bible's meaning, we should be asking: "What's the story that's unfolding here and why did people find it important to tell it? What was it that moved them to record these words? What was happening in the world at that time? What does this passage/story/poem/verse/book about how people understood who they were and who God was at that time?" In asking these questions, Rob goes beyond the one-dimensional question of "is it true?" to reveal the Bible's authentic transformative power.

Rob addresses the concerns of all those who see the Bible as God's Word but are troubled by the ethical dilemmas, errors, and inconsistencies in Scripture. With What Is the Bible?, he recaptures the Good Book's magic and reaffirms its power and inspiration to shape and inspire our lives today.

Kim heard about Family Promise from The River Church (in Holly). She and her family attended The River and they were eventually forced to turn to them help/guidance. Someone at The River knew about Family Promise and gave Kim the number.

Today, Cameron is serving our country, in the Army. Kim and the girls have moved into a smaller home, more suitable for just the 4 of them and more affordable. Kim and the girls have attended several Family Promise graduate events and even attended the 5k fundraiser in 2015. Since graduation, Family Promise grant money has been used to send her girls to camps at The River and she remains a positive force.

Thanks to St. Jude's and all of the Family Promise volunteers, her life and the lives of her 4 wonderful children have been forever changed.

The Kindness Rocks Project was created to spread inspiration and a moment of kindness for unexpecting recipients through random inspirational rocks dropped along the way.

Many people are feeling a sense of overwhelm, unease and restlessness due to the current events taking place in our world today. Kindness rocks can make a positive difference.

"Losing my parents at a young age meant losing my advisors, my sounding board and my role models" writes Megan Murphy, founder of The Kindness Rocks Project. "During difficult or stressful moments in my life, I found myself looking for 'signs' on my morning walk, such as a heart shaped rock or a piece of sea glass. I perceived these small beach treasures as 'signs' or as a dive message and the random inspiration I needed to signify that things would be ok. Maybe I wasn't the only one looking for such signs!"

Thus, the Kindness Rocks Project was born.

"It started as a hobby of one... painting and dropping a few rocks at a time when something amazing happened. I began receiving messages from strangers about how much the rock they found meant to them. So, I stepped up my rock painting and add-



ed social media and a website."

Murphy continues, "Now it has become a grass roots kindness movement. When a person finds a rock that speaks to him/ her, that person takes it home but makes another rock to drop and inspire someone else. The goal is to encourage others to find cool creative ways to reach out and brighten someone's day unexpectedly. Giving from your heart in service of others while expecting nothing in return is what this project is all about."
