"Spoiler alert......the tomb was empty." I recently heard this on a radio clip and I've seen a couple of cartoons with that same sentiment floating around lately as well. I can't remember ever seeing or hearing these words in years past. So, I began to wonder, why this year do we need a spoiler alert? I also began to wonder if raising the issue in this way indicates that the world is ready to start looking at what an empty tomb means.

We are about to enter into what I lovingly call the Marathon that is Holy Week. Once again we will tell the story about Jesus' last few days as he enters Jerusalem. By the time you read this we will have already begun or perhaps even completed our journey to the empty tomb and begun 50 days of celebration.

As we gaze into that empty tomb and once again see what's there and what's not there, I wonder, what does it mean for us today? How do we hear that story? Is it simply a tale from long, long ago, significant perhaps only at that time? Or does it continue to shape and change us today as well? What does it mean to be a people of the Resurrection? Is that just something that happens later or can we experience it here and now? How do we recognize Resurrection when it happens in the world today?

I believe that Resurrection does indeed happen today! In the world, in our individual lives and in our communities of faith. I've seen Resurrection in my own life. I've witnessed Resurrection shape and reshape communities of faith. I've seen Resurrection change the landscape of the world.

As we spend the season of Easter unpacking what Resurrection means to us today, I will I invite a conversation as a part of the Gathering Rite in our weekly liturgy with a question. "How have you witnessed Resurrection?" As we all awaken to signs of Resurrection here and now, I suspect we will also begin to discern what it means to be a people of Resurrection – to live in our lives the reality of the empty tomb.

May your experience of Holy Week lead you into a deeper and more profound and transformative Easter season!

#### Vestry Notes - March, 2018

The Vestry met with a full agenda of reports and items to discuss:

- \* Follow up on their suggestion that a proposal by an architect be obtained. Ron Trimmer brought forward information on the Kahn architectural agency. The proposal was reviewed and discussed and the Vestry agreed that the By-laws require two additional proposals. We are moving forward to obtain additional proposals, gather ideas and information on the proposed Sanctuary project.
- \* Tracie reported her intention to rent a Labyrinth to have available in VandenBergh Hall for the Holy Week activities.
- \* Formation report informed about a "Hunger Dinner" exercise which intends to build empathy and sensitivity to food insecurity issues.

This course is a great foundation for lay preachers or anyone interested in learning more about scripture.

*Crust* continues to graciously send their delicious (and plentiful!) coffee cake on a weekly basis – for which we give our thanks too!


