RECTORS REPORT

I would like to thank you all for your support and your prayers as I engage in the second intensive class work for my D.Min. in Preaching. As I write, I have completed week 1, Preaching as Performance, and had an incredibly powerful week! And I've begun to write my learning goals for the coming year. You may be interested in knowing that my first learning goal involves returning to preaching without notes.

When we first learned that our residency was cancelled, the course work itself was in question as the powers that be wrestled with whether or not they could offer our classes online. It's been wonderful to see everyone who returned, albeit in tiny boxes on the screen, and to catch up as we engage in intensive learning once again. In our Zoom space, God is challenging me and pushing me to grow in my preaching.

I must admit, I was hesitant about returning this year, given the online format. However, since learning that we would, indeed, be studying, I began experimenting with locations in the house, confident that my normal office space was not going to work for me. We've now turned our spare bedroom into my temporary office and I've placed my borrowed table, which is my desk, in front of the window so I have lots of natural light. From my desk, I'm able to watch

God's creation as the birds play in and around the branches of the blue spruces and the bunnies hop in the various gardens, sampling plants.

As I've reflected over this first weekend between classes, I've been thinking about the importance of space. When the pandemic first closed our buildings and we began our online worship, I encouraged people to create worship spaces. Places in their homes with items that would help them focus on God as they prayed and worshipped. There have been a few times when I've challenged people to create or include particular kinds of items that would help focus the season.

Place is important. And, we've all been limited the places where we move around to the rooms in our homes for several months now. I can't remember a time when I've had such a limited environment. My office tends to move around the house. especially now that the weather is nice, as I've worshipped with you from the back deck, participated in adult Bible Study or dialed in to Outreach meetings sitting on the front porch, worked in the dining room and now, as I study in my Chicago Room. As I've moved my "office" around the various places in our home, I've noticed how my space affects my mood and my experience

Keepers of the Light

For God . . . made his light shine in our hearts.



They call them "Keepers of the Light."

At the lighthouse on the cape of Hatteras Island just off the North Carolina coast of the United States, there's a memorial to those who've tended the light stations there since 1803. Shortly after the existing structure was moved inland because of shoreline erosion, the names of the keepers were etched on the old foundation stones and arranged into an amphitheater shape facing the new site. That way—as a placard explains today's visitors can follow in the historical keepers' footsteps and "watch over" the lighthouse as well.

Jesus is the ultimate light-giver. He said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). That's a radical thing for anyone to claim. But Jesus said it to affirm His relationship with His heavenly Father, the Creator of light and life who sent Him.

When we look to Jesus for salvation and follow His teaching, we're restored in relationship with God, and He gives us new power and purpose. His transforming life and love—"the light of all mankind" (1:4)—shines in us and through us and out to a dark and sometimes dangerous world.

As believers in Jesus, we become "keepers of the light." May others see His light shine from us and discover the life and hope He alone can give!

Because there is a team working on this, we have the capability of offering more content and a greater variety of ways to engage the content. For instance, there are both online elements and completely screen free elements. You can choose which opportunities to explore. Our plans are to include:

Compassion Camp-in-a-Box. Materials for the program will be sent to each participant.

- Story
- Crafts
- Music
- Movement & Mindfulness: Think Yoga Class and Meditation.
- Optional Zoom Gatherings

From the Curriculum Authors: As we look around the world, what becomes clearer each day is our deep need for compassion—now more than ever. Each of these five sessions has a central scripture passage about the day's theme. Compassion Camp's goal is to cultivate compassion for eachother, ourselves and the world.

The program will be offered the weeks of July 26 and August 2, 9, 16 and 23. Watch for further details soon.




