# RECTORS REPORT

We are now in the 9th month of experiencing the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic and shifting gears. In some ways, these past months have flown by. And in some ways, it seems like forever ago that we met for worship in our building. In those early days, I found the learning curve was steeper than I thought I could grow through. Now setting up a Zoom meeting and streaming into Facebook Live seems like old hat. We're even beginning to experiment with new ways of expanding participation in our online worship.

It's been a long 9 months, and it seems we aren't quite finished with this new and not ideal way of gathering. We can, however, see some light at the end of this tunnel as at least two vaccines are showing great promise. In the meantime, we must continue in this posture. The four Episcopal Dioceses in Michigan have now walked us back to a newly created phase of re-entry called 1-1/2. In this phase, we cannot meet for in-person worship. However, we can record the service in the church building. For a number of reasons, I made the decision to continue welcoming you into our home and recording the worship from home.

If you are like me, your emotions have been riding a roller coaster throughout these many months. I've discovered that the importance of tending to all of my health is critical right now. I need the daily discipline of prayer, Bible reading, and reflecting. I need to carve out times during the day to do something that feeds my soul. I need to ensure that I get outside from time to time and walk. It's in those times that I'm not attentive to self-care that things don't go so well. I encourage you as the weather continues to deepen into late fall and then into winter, that you spend some time thinking about those activities that bring you life and finding safe ways to accomplish them. And remember, this isn't going to last forever. One day we'll get on top of this virus and things will begin to return to normal.

I'm convinced that we, as church, have learned a lot during this pandemic. As we begin to move back into a more normal posture, I will be working with leadership on reflecting on what has gone well during this time and what we'd like to carry forward. Where is God in the midst of all that we have been doing and how is God calling us to serve as we move forward. I will be inviting lots of input from everyone, so stay tuned for ways to communicate your thoughts.

As we move into holiday times and reimagine what our gatherings need to look like in order to keep all of our families healthy, may you find life-giving ways to safely stay connected with family and friends. I look forward to dreaming forward with all of you as we continue to move through this experience.

# **Instruments of Peace**

"Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness."

James 3:18



When World War I erupted in 1914, British statesman Sir Edward Grey declared, "The lamps are going out all over Europe; we shall not see them lit again in our lifetime." Grey was right. When the "war to end all wars" finally ended, some 20 million had been killed (10 million of them civilians) and another 21 million injured.

While not on the same scale or magnitude, devastation can also occur in our personal lives. Our home, workplace, church, or neighborhood can also be shrouded by the dark specter of conflict. This is one of the reasons God calls us to be differencemakers in the world. But to do so we must rely on His wisdom. The apostle James wrote, "The wisdom that comes

from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness" (James 3:17-18).

The role of peacemaker is significant because of its harvest. The word righteousness means "right standing" or "right relationship." Peacemakers can help restore relationships. No wonder Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God" (Matthew 5:9). His children, relying on His wisdom, become instruments of His peace where it's needed most.

# Christmas Families Giving Opportunities For You in 2020

Our great St. Jude's caring and sharing family – coordinated through your Outreach Committee – is reaching out again this Christmas to provide gifts for families in our community including our Holly Group Home to help them celebrate their Christmas.

Things change every year, and boy have there been changes in 2020! With your help and support, we can still reach out to those in need. We will be helping 5 families--2 families from Family Promise, plus the residents of the Holly Group Home or approximately 30 people. Our hope is to also provide \$100 per family from the Saturday Food Distribution program. Additionally, we would like to provide 10-15 \$25 gas cards to the staff at the Holly Group Home, and to each family. It sounds like a tall order, but with the help of God we can do this!

This year, to respect the dignity of every human being, we will again be asking for gift cards allowing each family the opportunity to purchase and wrap gifts for their own family. Last year we learned that Visa cards charge a fee, so this year we are asking for donations of gift cards from Walmart, Meijer's and Target. We are hoping to provide \$100 in gift cards for each family member.

At a later time, the Outreach Committee will provide a list of ideas/suggestions for the Holly Group Home residents, and the Family Numbers to use when donating gift cards. This list will be posted in the Weekly and Monthly Beacons. It would be great if you could review the list, and then call Mike and Judy Marinco (810/629-8074) to sign up for the gift(s) you would like to purchase.

Please wrap the Holly Group Home gift(s), and on the outside of your gift securely place a tag with the resident's name. (So far, gifts have been purchased for Willie and for Todd.) Bring your donations to the church any Saturday from 10-12 by our deadline of Sunday, December 12th. If you need to make special arrangements to drop off your donation, please call Mike or Judy Marinco (810/629-8074) or Carol or John Pettipher (248/255-2260).

Please submit your gas and/or gift cards in a sealed envelope showing the cash value and your name. As an alternative to purchasing a gift(s) or gift cards, you may prefer to donate money to help our Christmas Families. If so, please write a check to St. Jude's, and note on the check memo line: "Christmas Families." Your check can be mailed to the church office. Donations could also be made on-line; be sure to indicate "Christmas Families" on your donation.


