Rector's Report

How are you doing? It's a question that I find myself asking all of the time in the course of normal conversations. And it's a question that I hear often in those same conversations. How are you doing? If you're like me, you probably find yourself asking and answering that question as often as you meet or talk to other people each day. How are you doing?

How often have you asked that question of yourself? How am "I" doing? And how often have you stopped and taken the time to not only think through the answer, but put words to your answer. How am "I" doing? Especially now as we move our way through the pandemic, especially as we're all finding ourselves tired and stressed perhaps, taking the time to ask yourself that question and even more so taking the time to answer that question is essential.

At times over the course of my life, when I've taken the time to do a kind of honest, personal inventory of how I'm doing, I find that I don't really like the answer. Then I have to ask myself, so what do I need to do about it? What do I need to focus on? Who can support me in those efforts? What tools might I need to rely on to help me achieve change?

How will I hold myself accountable to paying attention to all of my health – physical, emotional and spiritual.

I think the other place we need to ask the question is here in our faith community. How are WE doing? As we approach the end of the year and especially as we approach our annual pledge campaign, I think it is essential that we ask that question. How are we doing as a faith community? How are we answering God's call to participate in God's mission here in Fenton and now in 2021 – 2022. Our pledge campaign also invites us to prayerfully consider how each of us can participate in God's mission here at St. Jude's.

As you read through this monthly Beacon you will see reports of how we are doing at St. Jude's. You'll see glimpses of what God is up to here at St. Jude's and in the greater Fenton area. I wonder.....how do you see God in the midst of all that we are doing? What might God be calling us to focus on? Who can support us in this mission? How will we hold ourselves accountable to fulfilling God's call here?

Yes, it seems like this is an ideal time to be asking ourselves as

During the summer months she went the extra mile coordinating multi-generational events that helped us all to play our way to spiritual growth. Evidence of her connecting can be found at countless places in the community as her Kindness Rocks projects brought smiles to those who found our works of art. Kris jumped on board with an already in progress Pilgrimage planning with the youth group, adjusting it to fit St. Jude's needs and walking with a small, multigenerational group of people who grew much deeper in faith through their experiences in South Carolina. Many of us enjoyed soup and baked goods from the jars she made with our youth. During the pandemic she live-streamed a few multigenerational stories, helping us all engage differently with scripture. Many of us received Pentecost porch drops during the pandemic that helped us all to experience the holiness of that day differently and powerfully. That gift gave way to every home porch drops to connect us all during major formational times in the church year. Her work on Christmas pageants helped us all to play the story of Christ's birth during worship. Before I arrived, she brought Messy Church to St. Jude's and was a major part of our learning from that experience as we moved away from Messy Church and into Godly Play and multi-generational formation events held throughout the year.

Kris's work with us has been powerful and transformational! I will deeply miss working together with Kris and I am deeply thankful for having got to learn from her and with her over my time with her these past 5 ½ years.


