Please know that all of you are in my daily prayers and will remain there throughout this transition and as you seek your next Rector.

Just a really quick update on my D.Min. in Preaching. At this point my thesis is complete and I will be defending it on March 30. After that, I should, I pray, graduate in May! Entering and moving through this degree process has been challenging and rewarding, eye-opening and lifegiving. I am so thankful for my family's love, support and understanding and I'm deeply thankful and humbled by St. Jude's willingness to walk alongside me and fill in what seemed like an endless stream of feedback tools. Thank you, all of you, for everything you've done to help me accomplish this goal! Although not required for my new position, everything I've learned affects every aspect of ministry for me and I'm looking forward to seeing how it can be applied in a new way. We will send out specific invitations to the members of my Parish Project Group and will send a general invitation for all of St. Jude's through e-mail and whatever other means you choose to announce.

On a very personal note, I want all of you to know that it has been such an honor and joy to serve God with you all. Especially in these past couple of Covid years, I know how much we have all had to learn new technology, enter into conversations that we never ever even dreamed of having, accepted and lived into difficult Diocesan decisions to lock the building, came up with our own protocols more recently, the list goes on and on...... You have all participated with Grace and wisdom and support and prayer. And for that I am deeply thankful. To say that the last two years have been challenging and difficult would be, perhaps, the greatest understatement ever spoken. was evident in every single moment, in every single painful place, in every single joy-filled place. Over and over again I have been overwhelmed by God's presence and God's love and God's guidance.

That reality will not disappear as I take my leave. I know with every fiber of my being that there is a much deeper awareness of God here at St. Jude's! There has been an incredible transformation because of that awareness. As you move through this time of transition, remembering how you have become more aware of God's presence will, I think, be helpful, perhaps even essential. And when it's challenging to remember, call someone from the congregation perhaps who you know has "God stories". Ask them to tell you a story of their experience of God. Allow their story to fill your soul. Those stories may help you to remember and sense God's presence and may help you to remember or discover how to tell your own story. And pray. Pray for yourselves. Pray for St. Jude's. Know that you are not alone in this process. God is travelling with you and beckoning you to a new place where God already is!

Almost six years ago now I stepped through the door for the first time. I knew only a handful of

people, some from Diocesan events, some from my time with the search committee. I didn't know most of you. As Dave and I were welcomed to a joint Search Committee and Vestry evening, I asked everyone what they loved most about St. Jude's. Every single person I asked replied with the same answer. The people. As I leave, my voice joins theirs. I love so much about this place. The liturgy, the outreach, the learning and growing that happens in every generation at St. Jude's. And when you get right down to it, what I love most is the people. You have all become my family! Thank you for that. It is an incredible gift and one I do not receive lightly. I hold you all gently in my soul. You have all become a part of who I am today. I have grown and been transformed because of my relationships with you all. And now, as I said in my letter, it is time to depart and to see where all of this growth leads. As I leave it is time for you to see where all of your growth will take vou.

God's blessings be with you as you grow! God's blessings wrap and fill and lead you!


Today, I gift this to you as a thank-offering and a reminder of the importance, no the essential reality, of spending time with God in the wilderness.

Etch A Sketch Forgiveness

As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

Psalm 103:12



The little red rectangular box was magical. As a kid, I could play with it for hours. When I turned one knob on the box, I could create a horizontal line on its screen. Turn the other knob and voila—a vertical line. When I turned the knobs together, I could make diagonal lines, circles, and creative designs. But the real magic came when I turned my Etch A Sketch toy upside down, shook it a little and turned it right side up. A blank screen appeared, offering me the opportunity to create a new design.

God's forgiveness works much like that Etch A Sketch. He wipes away our sins, creating a clean canvas for us. Even if we remember wrongs we committed, God chooses to forgive and forget. He's wiped them out and doesn't hold our sins against us. He doesn't treat us according to our sinful actions (Psalm 103:10) but extends grace through forgiveness. We have a clean slate—a new life awaiting us when we seek God's forgiveness. We can be rid of guilt and shame because of His amazing gift to us.

The psalmist reminds us that our sins have been separated from us as far as the east is separated from the west (v. 12). That's as far away as you can get! In God's eyes, our sins no longer cling to us like a scarlet letter or a bad drawing. That's reason to rejoice and to thank God for His amazing grace and mercy.


