This is Grace

God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah.

Acts 2:36



Les Misérables begins with paroled convict Jean Valjean stealing a priest's silver. He's caught, and he expects to be returned to the mines. But the priest shocks everyone when he claims he'd given the silver to Valjean. After the police leave, he turns to the thief, "You belong no longer to evil, but to good."

Such extravagant love points to the love that flowed from the fountain from which all grace comes. On the day of Pentecost, Peter told his audience that less than two months before, in that very city, they had crucified Jesus. The crowd was crushed and asked what they must do. Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins" (Acts 2:38). Jesus had endured the punishment

they deserved. Now their penalty would be forgiven if they put their faith in Him.

Oh, the irony of grace. The people could only be forgiven because of Christ's death—a death they were responsible for. How gracious and powerful is God! ST. JUDE'S ENDOWMENT FUNDS


depending on your wishes:

- HERITAGE FUND The Heritage Fund was established many years ago. The purpose of this outreach fund is providing for the unmet material and spiritual needs of the parish, community, and church universal. The full value of the donated principal will be invested, with the investment earnings being used to fund grants, non-profit groups and organizations on an annual basis. Many St. Jude's members have contributed to this fund with many grants being made to various organizations throughout the years.
- CAPITAL FUND The Capital Fund is used to fund maintenance and preservation of our historic building and grounds. The full value of the donated principal will be invested, with the investment earnings used to perform upgrades to the facilities as they are identified and approved by the vestry over time.
- ETERNAL PLEDGE FUND The Eternal Pledge Fund is used to fund annual operating expenses of our church. The full value of the donated principal will be invested, with investment earnings used to support St. Jude's annual operating budget. It is a great way to support the future ministry of our church.

It is all about special gifts. There are many ways of making special gifts and bequests and some offer significant income or estate tax benefits. Gifts may be made today during your lifetime from cash, investments, or other assets. Other options involve planned giving for tomorrow by including the St. Jude's Endowment Fund in your will or trust. That might include approaches such as a bequest, a Charitable Gift Annuity, or a Charitable Remainder Trust.

Regardless of the approach that is best for you, it is important to discuss your giving plans with your accountant or financial professional. Complete and detailed information regarding St. Jude's Endowment Funds is available for review by you and your advisors from the church office or an Endowment Committee member.

We contacted Ron Trimmer and he also thought it was a great idea and he would talk the Vestry. Vestry agreed and so that is where we are at today.


We thought we would give Liz some time to clean them up and start this up in the fall.
