The Fruit Sells the Tree

The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

Galatians 5:22-23



A nursery owner set out to sell peach trees. She considered various approaches. Should she line up leafy saplings in burlap sacks in a beautiful display? Should she create a colorful catalog picturing peach trees in various seasons of growth? At last she realized what really sells a peach tree. It's the peach it produces: sweet-smelling, deep orange, and fuzzy-skinned. The best way to sell a peach tree is to pluck a ripe peach, cut it open until the juice dribbles down your arm, and hand a slice to a customer. When they taste the fruit, they want the tree.

God reveals Himself in a wrapper of spiritual fruit in His followers: *love, joy, peace, forbearance (patience), kindness, goodness, faithfulness,* gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22–23). When believers in Jesus exhibit such fruit, others will want that fruit as well, and, therefore, will seek the Source of the fruit that's so attractive.

Fruit is the external result of an internal relationship—the influence of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Fruit is the dressing that beckons others to know the God we represent. Like the bright peaches standing out against the green leaves of a tree, the fruit of the Spirit announces to a starving world, "Here is food! Here is life! Come and find a way out of exhaustion and discouragement. Come and meet God!"

Rector Search Update

I want to give you an update on what is happening with the search for a new priest for our church. If you aren't aware, the Search Committee is made up of the following parishioners: Diane Putnam, Denise Rayner, Megan Rosa, Katie Young, Paul Dolza, Mark Jagos, David James, and yours truly. The Rev. Don Davidson is acting as consultant on behalf of the Diocese.

At this point, we have met several times and we are in the process of, or have completed the following tasks:

- 1. Established a search budget
- 2. Completed a parish survey to understand the wants and needs of the congregation as it pertains to a new rector. By the way, over 80% of the congregation has participated in the survey. We still want your feedback if you haven't taken it yet. Please let someone know on the search committee and we will be sure that happens.
- 3. We are putting the final touches on the Congregational Profile and are aiming to have that completed and ready to share with the congregation at the end of August. The Profile provides a high-level view of St. Jude's to prospective candidates.
- 4. The Episcopal Church narrative is also nearing completion and should be done around the same time as the profile. The narrative goes into more depth about what we have done over the last several years as it pertains to how we worship, our ministries, how we interact with Episcopal Church as a whole and our surrounding communities.

Once the Profile and Narrative are complete, we can proceed with candidate collection and interviews. I cannot provide a timeframe for that part of the process. We will keep you informed about our progress during announcements at the 10:30am service and right here in the Beacon. In the meantime, we welcome your questions and appreciate your prayers during the search process.


