Loving Like Jesus

Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.

John 3:18



While waiting for a train at a station in Atlanta, Georgia, a young man wearing dress pants and a button-down shirt sat on a bench. As he struggled with his tie, an older woman encouraged her husband to help. When the elderly man hunched over and began teaching the young man how to knot the tie, a stranger took a photo of the trio. When this photo went viral online, many viewers left comments about the power of random acts of kindness.

For believers in Jesus, kindness to others reflects the self-sacrificing care that He showed for people like us. It's an expression of God's love and what He desired His disciples to live out: "We should *love* one another" (1 John 3:11 emphasis added). John equates

hating a brother or sister to murder (v. 15). Then he turns to Christ as an example of love in action (v. 16).

It doesn't have to be an extravagant display of sacrifice. Selfless love simply requires us to acknowledge the value of all God's image-bearers by placing their needs above our own . . . every day. Those seemingly ordinary moments when we care enough to notice the needs of others and do what we can to help are selfless when we're motivated by love. When we see beyond our personal space, step out of our comfort zones to serve others, and give—especially when we don't have to give—we're loving like Jesus.

What On Earth Is A Truckload Giveaway?



For many years St. Jude's has been working with other organizations in the community to provide food and other basic needs. Since the onset of the pandemic there are some of these programs that we have had to For example, we have not had a "Truckload Giveaway" since February of 2019, over 4 years. That's about to change, since we have scheduled a Giveaway for May 13th. It's been so long since we have held one of these events many of you may not be familiar with what we do (and others may have forgotten). So here is a brief overview of what we call a "Truckload Giveaway".

First and most important, this is truly a community effort. We purchase significantly discounted food from the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan (through their Mobile Pantry Program). Our host for the program is The Fenton Fire Department, and they are also a major source for volunteers. We receive support from Play Like Jackson and many student volunteers from the schools. St. Jude's role is one of coordination, advertising

& promotion, registration, setup, cleanup, and distribution of any leftover items to other local food pantries.

Around 7:30 am on the 13th a semi full of food weighing several tons will arrive at the Fire Hall. The food will be unloaded by volunteers and the truck driver. We will set up long tables in a 'U' shape inside the hall with the food in the middle. Volunteers will then fill the tables with food in preparation for our guests. While all this is going on our neighbors from the community will begin lining up in the Fire Hall parking lot. At 9:00 the doors will open, and guests will come in single file and register. Once registered, they will pick up a box(es) and a volunteer to help them shop. They will make a loop around the tables, selecting items of their choice. When they reach the end, a volunteer will help them carry the groceries to their car. This process will continue until 11:00 or until we run out of food.

Once the doors close we will need to find a home for whatever food remains. We have a long list of local charities that we will connect with and then load up the trucks/vans of St. Jude's volunteers to deliver what remains.

A sign up list is in Vandenburg Hall asking for help with setup, registration, distribution, clean up and delivery. If you have the time and energy please consider signing up. You will find it to be a rewarding morning, especially the opportunity to interact with our guests.


3rd Annual Craft Show & Holiday Bazaar
