As noted in the Building and Grounds report, we are tackling some long overdo projects, which will help make our church building more accessible for all.



MUSIC NOTES



Last month, I had the wonderful opportunity to travel to the Sewanee Church Music Conference, a weeklong conference for Episcopal Church musicians that is held every year in Tennessee. This is my fourth trip to the "Holy Mountain," and it is one I look forward to for spiritual fulfillment, practical learning, and comradery.

Every year, there are two clinicians who lead the bulk of the conference. This year, we had Jeremy Filsell, the Director of Music at St. Thomas, New York City, and Janette Fishell, the chair of the organ department for the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. Additionally, the conference Chaplain the last handful of years has been the Reverend Barbara Cawthorne Crafton, a priest and author with such a knack for words that she could make a grown adult laugh and weep just by reading the phone book. The conference has a rather strict schedule, beginning with a Compline on Monday evening. There is a Eucharist every day, including a service for the departed. On Friday, the conference presents an Evensong, and it closes on Sunday with a public Eucharist at All Saints Chapel. As one could imagine, there is a lot of rehearsal throughout the week.

Between all the rehearsals, there are number of other events and interest sessions: several reading sessions, an organ masterclass, Janette's recital, or a guide to creative hymn-playing, just to name a few. In addition, there are a few confereeled sessions, such as my friend Ron's yoga classes, or the infamous Frolic following the Friday Evensong.

Certainly, there are a multitude of practical and musical reasons for attending the conference. It's a wonderful networking tool where directors can meet and collaborate (hint hint), and the local music store, Lois Fyfe, is an absolute wealth of knowledge. The real magic of the conference, however, can hardly be put into words. It's in the morning conversation with my roommate Michael, or the feeling of a "thin place"

when standing on the mountaintop, overlooking the valley below. It's in the deep, lifelong friendship that it fosters for many of its annual conferees, myself included. Simply put, it fills the soul. As conference director Kevin Simons said at the annual banquet, "The Sewanee Church Music Conference is a place that forms church musicians," and I am inclined to agree.

It's CROP Walk Time Again!



This will be the 42nd Annual CROP Walk in Fenton, and St. Jude's has been actively involved since the beginning. Members of St. Jude's have been on the planning committee for over 30 years and have chaired or co-chaired the walk for 17 of those years. The walk has raised over \$445,00 for hunger related efforts and \$111,000 of that has been used right here in our community. Our own Pantry & School Lunch programs have been blessed to receive almost \$18,000.

This year's walk will look a bit different than in the past. We will be starting on Elizabeth Street between St. Jude's and 1st Presbyterian and before the walk there will be a potluck in St. Jude's parking lot. Hot dogs will be provided by the CROP Committee and each of the participating churches will be responsible for bringing a certain type of picnic food. St. Jude's has signed up to bring Veggies & Dip, Chips and Fruit. There is a signup sheet in Vandenburg Hall on the Outreach board and each person that signs up is asked to bring enough for at least 10 people (if 10 people sign up we'll have enough food for 100 people). Note that we will also be inviting our friends from Millpond Manor to join the party!

This year the walk will be held on **September 24** with the Potluck starting at 12:30 and the walk commencing at 1:15. The kickoff for the walk will be done by our new Priest, Rev. Susan Anslow Williams! This means that we will need to vacate the parking lot by 12:15 that day, so be prepared.

Finally, as always, what really makes the walk work is people walking and donating. We look forward to this being a fun event with lots of participation from St. Jude's as are one of the host churches.

REFLECTIONS

Empowered for the Everyday

Whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus.



Every Moment Holy is a beautiful book of prayers for a variety of activities, including ordinary ones like preparing a meal or doing the laundry. Necessary tasks that can feel repetitive or mundane. The book reminded me of the words of author G. K. Chesterton, who wrote, "You say grace before meals. All right. But I say grace before sketching, painting, swimming, fencing, boxing, walking, playing, dancing and grace before I dip the pen in the ink."

Such encouragement reorients my perspective on the activities of my day. Sometimes I'm inclined to divide my activities into ones that appear to have spiritual value, like reading devotions before a meal, and other activities I think have little spiritual value, such as doing the dishes after the meal. Paul erased that divide in a letter to the people of Colossae who had chosen to live for Jesus. He encouraged them with these words: "Whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus" (3:17). Doing things in Jesus' name means both honoring Him as we do them and having the assurance that His Spirit helps strengthen us to accomplish them.

"Whatever you do." All the ordinary activities of our lives, every moment, can be empowered by God's Spirit and done in a way that honors Jesus.


