The First Lesson_____ Genesis 3:1-15
Adam and Eve disobey God, and must leave the Garden of Eden.

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LordGod had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?"
